Housing Aids for Older People – up to 100% grant in owner-occupied homes, for persons age 60 or over, of up to €10,500 for necessary improvements – rewiring, roof repair, central heating (where none), and replacing of existing boiler when broken beyond repair. Mobility Aids – Up to 100% grant of up to €6,000 to address mobility problems, certified by a doctor (e.g. rails, ramps, stairlifts and level access showers) in owned private rented homes where the annual household income is under €30,000.(info as above).

Housing Adaptation (Disability) – Up to 95% grant af up to €30,000 to adapt a home to suit the needs of a person with an enduring disability (e.g. downstairs toilet/shower, wheelchair adaptation, extension, etc) in owned or private rented homes. The works must be certified necessary by a doctor and may require an Occupational Therapist Report. (info as above).

SAFER HOMES

Locks, chain reinforcing, security lighting and "pendant" alarms are now available from the Society of St Vincent de Paul, with funding from Social Welfare). Friends of the Elderly offer flexible assistance with odd jobs for older people (Tel: 873 1855).

A home insulation scheme for pensioners and incapacitated people (who are on Fuel Allowance), through Energy Action (454 5464) – and Chip (467 0344). Energy Action will insulate attics, draught-proof doors and windows, fit a lagging jacket, a smoke alarm and two energy-saving light bulbs, fit a mortise lock and a spy hole. Chip will do a full insulation package including insulation of cavity walls.

IDENTIFYING ELDER ABUSE

Elder abuse is defined as: "a single or repeated act or lack of appropriate action occurring within any relationship where there is an expectation of trust and which causes harm or distress to an older person or violates their human and civil rights". Elder abuse can occur in many forms and may be the result of deliberate intent, negligence or ignorance, including:

Physical abuse - non-accidental infliction of physical force, or the misuse of medication or inappropriate restraint.

Psychological or emotional abuse - persistent use of threats, humiliation, bullving, intimidation, isolation, and verbal conduct causing mental or physical distress.

Financial or material abuse - unauthorised and improper use of funds, property or any resources of an older person, or not contributing to household costs as previously agreed.

Sexual abuse - any sexual acts to which an older person has not or could not consent. including talking to or touching in a sexual way.

Neglect - repeated deprivation of assistance needed by an older person, e.g. physical care needs, access to appropriate health services, necessities such as adequate nutrition and heating.

Discriminatory abuse – such as racism, ageism, harassment, slur or similar treatment.

Institutional abuse – poor standards of care, rigid routines and inadequate response to complex needs in nursing homes, hospitals or any residential or in-patient settings.

The National Centre for the Protection of Older People (NCPOP) is conducting research into elder abuse in Ireland to contribute to the development of policy, practice, and education. Its website **www.ncpop.ie** is a resource for all those working with older people in areas such as health and social care, legal and financial services, as well as for older people themselves.

The HSE dedicated elder abuse service receives over 1,800 referrals for alleged cases of elder abuse each year. Ten percent of those referrals related to individuals living in nursing homes or continuing care environments.

NURSING HOMES SUPPORT SCHEME (FAIR DEAL)

The Nursing Homes Support Scheme provides financial support for people who need long-term nursing home care. Under the scheme, on the basis of an assessment of your care needs and a means test, you will make a contribution towards the cost of your care and the State will pay the balance, whether the nursing home is public, private or voluntary.

WHEN TO CALL AN AMBULANCE

You should always call **112** or **999** in a life-threatening emergency, if someone is seriously ill or injured, and their life is at risk. Examples of medical emergencies include (but are not limited to): Chest pain, Difficulty in breathing. Unconsciousness. Severe loss of blood. Severe burns or scalds. Choking. Fitting or concussion. Drowning. Severe allergic reactions.

MEDICAL CARDS

Medical Cards allow people to access GP services, community health services, dental services, hospital care and a range of other benefits free of charge.

The quickest way to apply for a medical card is online, on **www.medicalcard.ie.**

Make sure you have all the information you need to hand, such as your PPS number and those of your dependants, details of your income and outgoings.

GENERAL HOSPITAL ENTITLEMENTS

Everyone is entitled to public in-patient and out-patient hospital services, subject to waiting lists for treatment. However, hospital tests or care arising from private consultancy services must be paid for privately, unless you revert to the public waiting list for the treatment.

Charges: With the exception of Medical Card Holders (and children with long term ailments), the following charges apply in major public hospitals:

Casualty and Outpatient - €100 unless referred by your doctor or admitted to hospital

Public ward bed - €75 per night (up to a max of €750 in a year)

Private patients pay €1,118 per night (semi-private), €1,243 (private) or €916 (day care).

During 2012, the distinction between public and private beds will be ended; all private patients will then be charged at private bed rates.

HOME CARE SCHEMES

A Home Care Package can fund a care plan in the family home to keep a person out of institutional care. Application form available on line at **www.hse.ie** or call **1890 24 1850**, or contact the Dun Laoghaire Social Welfare Office: Tel: (01) 2145540.

Carers' allowance: A carer who is living with a person requiring full-time care can apply for a means-tested weekly Carers' Allowance plus an annual Respite Grant. You can get information and application forms from your local Social Welfare Office, 18-21 Cumberland Street, Dun Laoghaire, Tel: (01) 2145540, or LoCall the Department of Social Protection at 1890 20 23 25 or visit www.welfare.ie.

Home Help Services work with vulnerable people in the community who, through illness or disability, are in need of help with day-to-day tasks with housework, shopping, or personal care. Apply to the local public health nurse, who will assess your need for the service and process the application to your Local Health Office, Tivoli Road, Dún Laoghaire, Co. Dublin Tel: (01) 284 3579 / (01) 236 5200

If you are aged 66 or over or permanently incapacitated, and living alone (except for dependants, a spouse on Social Welfare, another pensioner, or someone giving you full-time care), you can receive the following concessions along with your social welfare pension:

Electricity allowance covers standing charge and up to 1.800 units per year. Locall: 1890 500 000

Telephone Allowance towards your telephone bill in respect of either a landline or mobile phone. Locall: **1890 500 000**

Free Television Licence – Available from next renewal date of your television licence. once you gualify for the Household Benefits Package. At age 70 or over, you gualify for these schemes regardless of your income and you can get telephone allowance while residing in a nursing home. If you are widowed and 60 or over, you retain the free schemes and free travel if your late spouse had them. Locall: **1890 500 000**

Free Travel: To gualify for a Free Travel Pass at age 66 or over, you must be living permanently in the State. If you are under age 66 and permanently living in the State, you will qualify for a Free Travel Pass if you are getting Invalidity Pension, Blind Pension, Disability Allowance or Carer's Allowance. Bereavement Grant: This is a once-off payment based on PRSI contributions of the deceased person or their spouse. The grant of €850 is payable on the death of an insured person or their spouse, or the death of the widow/widower of an insured person. Applications to: Social Welfare Services, College Road, Sligo. LoCall: 1890 500 000.

Taxation – Age Exemption: Persons aged 65 or over are exempt from payment of income taxif their gross income from all sources is under €18,000 per year if single or €36,000 if married. Full details of the Irish income taxation system, including PAYE, PRSI, Tax Credits, Allowances for Mortgage Interest, Medical Expenses, Health Insurance etc can be viewed online at www.revenue.ie as well as information on Capital Gains and Acquisitions Tax, Stamp Duty on property transactions etc. The Lo-call number in the Dublin area (city and county) for telephone enquiries on taxation is 1890 333 425.
